It is understandable that schools hope to achieve better results in these exams by giving drills and trainings to their students. However, as educationists, they should know better than anyone that primary students are still in their early stage of development and more exposure to the world is better than sitting in front of the desk, doing endless exercises. Primary schools should reconsider their policy of drills and provide more opportunities for students to acquire knowledge outside classrooms. I truly believe that by having a balanced development, students will definitely perform better in the examinations.

Finally, parents should also hold responsibilities of this lamentable phenomenon. When you walk into a bookstore in Causeway Bay, you can see many parents standing in front of the column of exercise books. Parents also like to send their children to tutorial schools. Can you imagine a childhood of attending tutorial classes after listening to teachers at school for eight hours everyday? I would never want a childhood like this. Therefore, it is important for parents to give less pressure to their children and let their children to have a childhood that is not only full of academic works.

At the same time, they become easy preys for campus thieves.

distractions. For example, students will listen music in class. The wide variety of entertainment like video games,

music, movies and other applications are also available on smartphones. Some cheeky students may even download

clips of sex and violence, which are indecent and disgusting, and share them with classmates. It offsets all the sound

and moral virtues instilled by the school.

skills of the public as a whole and hinders the development in Hong Kong.

mobile phones as fashion by smartphones companies promotes materialistic values in society. Instead of a tool of

communication, a smartphone is regarded as a new means of showing identity. The newer and the more expensive
